DARFUR – EDUCATIONAL FORUM AND FUND RAISER

Sunday, November 9 from 6:30 to 8:30 pm.

Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church and Bethesda Jewish Congregation together will host the third annual forum and fund raiser on Darfur. Speakers will include;

Colin Thomas Jensen, Policy Advisor for ENOUGH,
Ian Schwab, National Grass Roots Organizer for American Jewish World Service
Pastor Jeff Krehbiel of Church of the Pilgrims, Washington, DC and
Laura Lippman of Bethesda Jewish Congregation.



The speakers will discuss and answer questions about

- 1) the current situation both in Darfur and in the refugee camps,
 - 2) efforts in the United States to stop the genocide and
 - 3) why solar cookers are vital for the safety of women refugees.
- Attendees will be welcome to add their thoughts and experiences.



There will be a demonstration of a **solar cooker**. We will collect money to purchase cookers for Darfuri refugees in the camps in Chad. The cookers are literally life savers, as women do not have to risk leaving the camp to collect firewood, and health and safety are not endangered by an open fire. \$30 provides two solar cookers, two pots, two pot handlers and training in the use of the equipment. Any amount is welcome, as plastic bags are needed to help the sun's heat cook a meal. Also needed is a simple device used to make sure water has been heated enough to be free of bacteria. This is a huge health benefit.

Save Darfur is providing many **post cards** we hope to get signed and delivered to our new president right after the election. Both candidates have promised to stop the genocide and these cards remind him of promises made in the campaign.

Light refreshments, coffee, tea and soft drinks will be served. This event is open to the community so please urge your friends and neighbors to attend.
